Notice of Race

1 Rules

1.1 The event is governed by the rules as defined in the current version of *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

2 Sailing Instructions

2.1 The sailing instructions will be available by November 9th online at <u>https://www.atlantayachtclub.org/laser-frost-nip</u>.

3 Communication

3.1 The online official notice board is located at <u>https://www.atlantayachtclub.org/laser-frost-nip</u>.

4 Eligibility and Entry

- 4.1 The event is open to all boats of the Laser / ILCA class.
- 4.2 All Laser / ILCA rigs are allowed and will be scored as a single fleet. Sailors are allowed to change to and sail different rigs in different races.
- 4.3 Class legal sails are not required.
- 4.4 To be considered an entry in the event, a boat shall register prior to competing in races each day she participates.

5 Fees

5.1 There are no entry fees.

6 Schedule

- 6.1 Sundays: November 19, December 3, December 10
 - 1130 1215 Registration open at the Point.
 - 1257 First race warning signal.
 - More races to follow. No races will start after 1600.

7 Scoring

- 7.1 Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series.
- 7.2 A boat must compete in 50% or more of the completed and scored series races to qualify for an award.
- 7.3 A boat that has competed in 50% or more of the series races will be scored based on her best finishes from races in which she competed, using low point scoring. If a boat has sailed more than 50% of the races in the series, all races in which she competed above the 50% count will be dropped. Example: 14 races in series. To qualify, must have sailed in 7 races. The best scores from 7 races are counted. Scores from any additional races (8 up to 14) are excluded from the series score.

8 Awards

- 8.1 Awards will be given for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places.
- 8.2 Sailors must have participated in at least 50% of the completed races to qualify.
- 8.3 Awards will be given out after sailing on Sunday, December 10.

9 Risk Statement

9.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing Authority will not accept any liability for damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.

10 Additional Information

- 10.1 All Sailors shall be required to wear a Coast Guard approved life jacket while on the water.
- 10.2 Wet/dry suits are strongly recommended due to potential cold temperatures in November & December on Lake Allatoona.
- 10.3 Non AYC members may store their boat at AYC during the series. Competitors must park their trailers in the gravel parking spaces nearest to the Race Committee boat dock. All trailers must have a name on them, so AYC knows whom to call if not removed after the series.
- 10.4 AYC is 17 miles north of Atlanta. Take Exit 277 (Ga HWY 92) off I-75. Go east on Hwy 92 and turn left onto Hunt Rd. Go .2 miles, through Stop sign and immediately bear right through hairpin turn; the road changes to Kellogg Creek Rd. Go 1 mile and turn left onto Yacht Club Drive. Look for entrance to AYC on the right after one mile.
- 10.5 AYC prohibits firearms, and motorcycles on club premises.
- 10.6 It is the responsibility of AYC members/guests to take appropriate measures to safeguard their personal property while on club premises.
- 10.7 Camping and showers are available free at AYC.
- 10.8 Hotels are just 5 minutes away located at I-75 and Highway 92.
